Committing to nuclear power in this regulatory climate is dangerous and irresponsible

Millions of curies of lethal radioactive waste are being stored near you. With no solution for an environmentally-just repository, why would Governor Healey want to invest in more nuclear reactors across the Commonwealth?

The Nuclear Industry's Abandoned Commitment

When nuclear reactors were built, leaders in government and the nuclear industry gave their word that safe, permanent toxic waste solutions would be created. The commitment was clear: build the reactors and a responsible waste solution would follow. **They failed to deliver!**

Over 250 casks full of dangerous radioactive materials sit idle on the shores of our waterways, threatening the environmental safety and health of MA and surrounding regions. Even a partial radioactive release could contaminate the region. There is **still** no scientifically-sound or environmentally-just solution for storing this radioactive waste. Our communities are stuck with **the most toxic waste ever created** with no solution in sight. Escalating climate disruption makes this waste **extremely vulnerable** to storms, flooding, dam breaches, and power and security system interruptions.

Governor Healey, Falling in Line with Trump

Trump's administration is eviscerating regulations that shield the public and the environment from fatal radioactive disasters. And Governor Healey is aligning with Trump's crusade to de-regulate the agencies that oversee our health and safety. Governor Healey wants to overturn democratically-adopted guardrails that protect the people of the Commonwealth. Those guardrails block any new nuclear development until the conditions in Chapter 503* are fully met (*see below, the guardrails that are in Healey's way*).

Six lawmakers—three from the Senate, three from the House—will determine whether we can vote on our energy future or not. Demand that we keep the guardrails of Chapter 503 in place! Never again should we be exposed to radioactive pollution, rate-hikes, and the contamination of our waterways.

*Chapter 503 of the Acts of 1982 is a Massachusetts law that puts strong, democratic checks in place around nuclear power and its radioactive waste.

Chapter 503 of the Acts of 1982 contains the following preconditions for building and operating any new nuclear power facility here:

► Certification by the General Court that:

1. A federally licensed facility for permanent disposal of high-level radioactive waste is in operation.
2. Adequate emergency preparedness and evacuation plans are in place.
3. Effective emission standards have been promulgated to protect the public against the safety hazards of radioactive air pollutants.
4. Federally approved means for decommissioning are in place.
5. The proposed nuclear power plant offers the optimal means of meeting energy needs.

► Approval of a majority of voters in a statewide general election.
